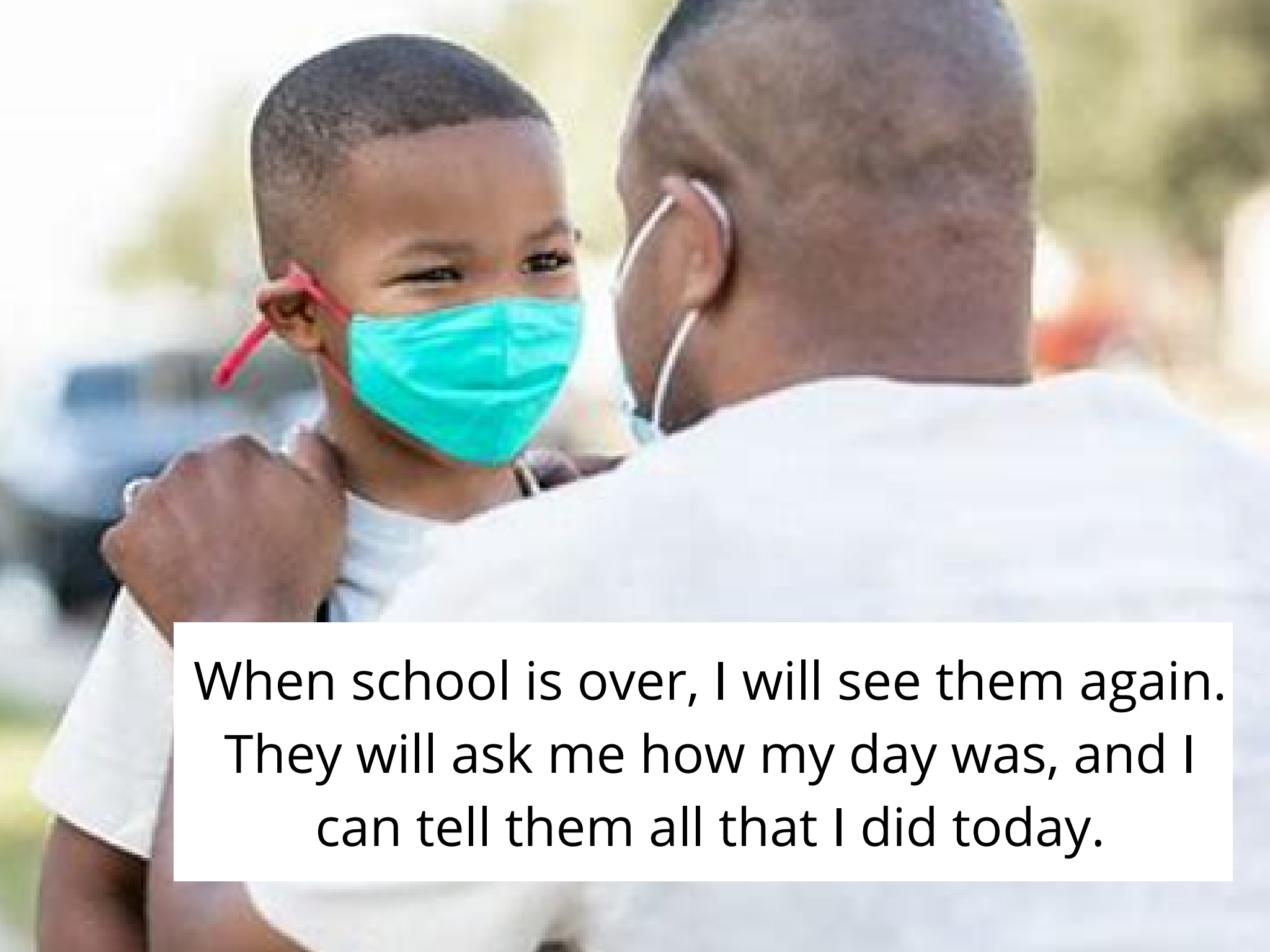


THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL

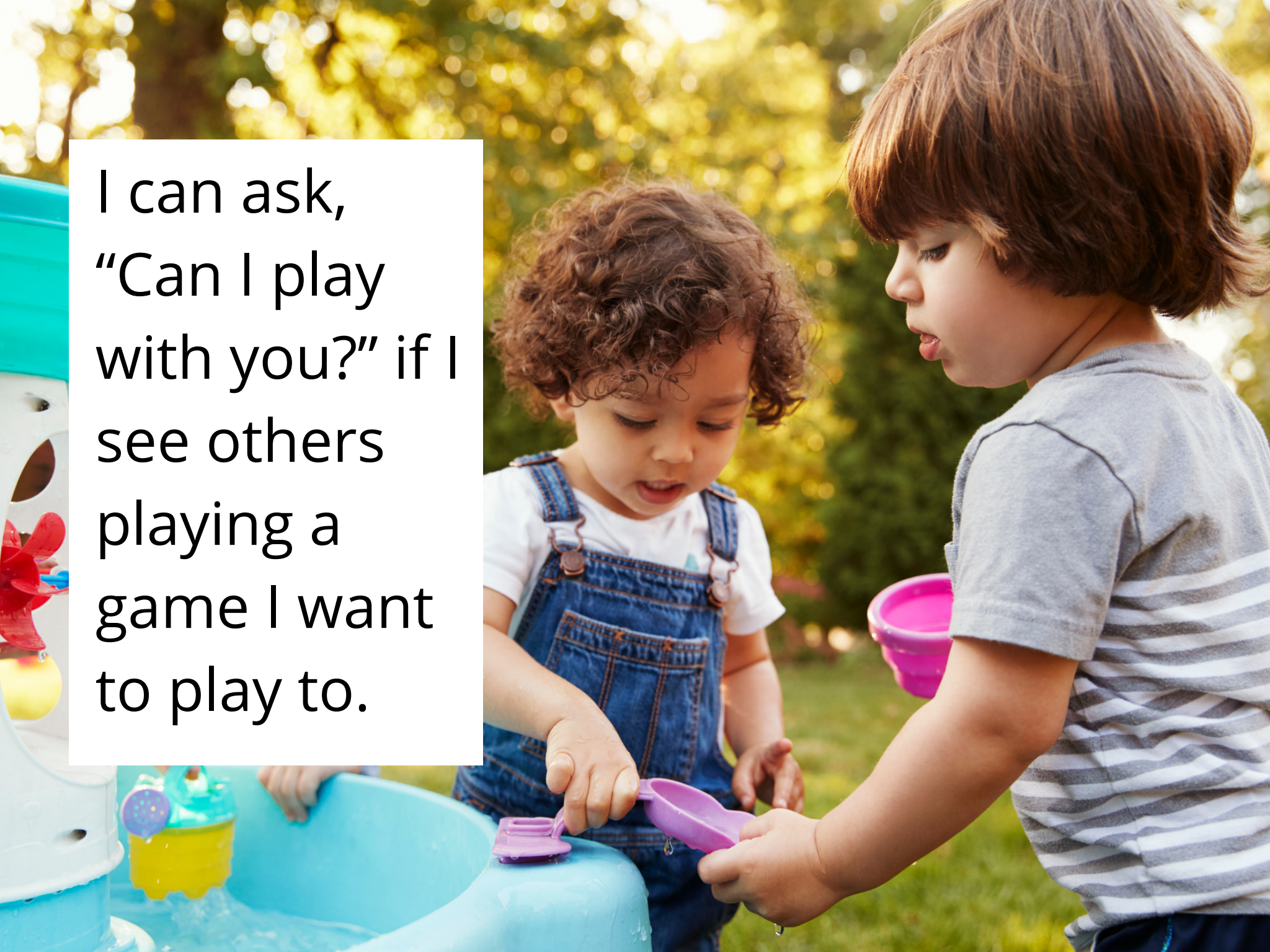


The other children and I will get to play together inside and outside.



I can say, "Will you play with me?" if I see someone who seems lonely.

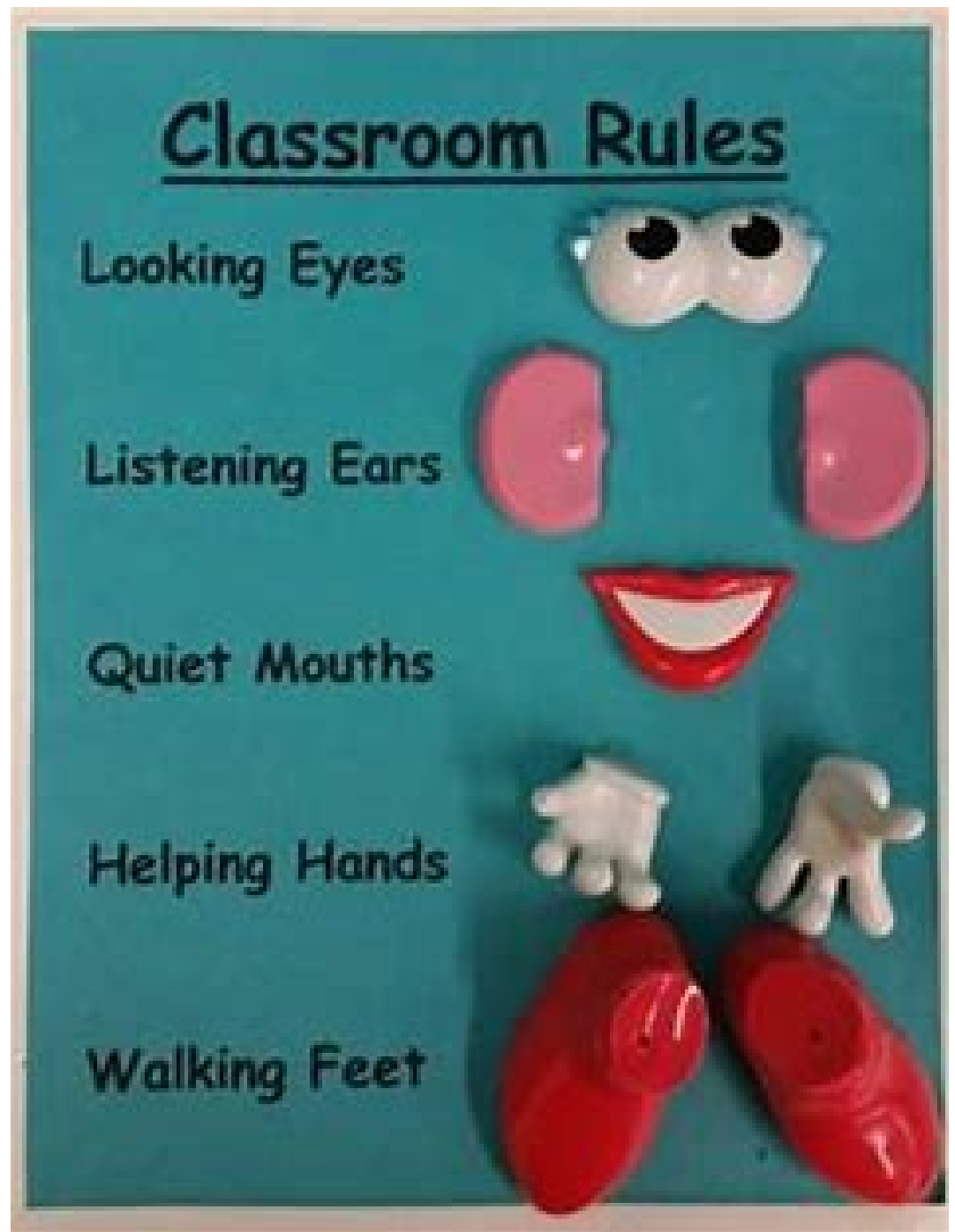
I can ask,
